POSITION SUMMARY

This internship offers students a hands-on introduction to how data flows within public health systems—and why that flow needs to be protected. As part of the Bureau's effort to strengthen data transparency and compliance, the intern will help develop a centralized tracker for Data Use Agreements (DUAs), allowing various program sections to upload and manage key documents. Through this project, students will gain exposure to real-world public health programs, learn the importance of secure data-sharing practices, and understand how agreements support collaboration between community providers and state program staff. It's a chance to explore public health from the inside out while contributing to meaningful infrastructure improvements.

Essential Position Duties and Responsibilities:

- Design and Implement Data Use Agreement (DUA) Tracker
- Ability to multitask and prioritize;

- Comfortable expressing thoughts clearly in writing and in person, and able to ask thoughtful questions that show initiative and interest.
- Familiarity with digital platforms like Microsoft Office, OneDrive, and shared drives; open to learning new systems as needed.
- Understand the importance of handling sensitive data with confidentiality and professionalism, especially in health-related contexts.
- Motivated to take on tasks, ask for clarification, and complete work reliably with minimal supervision.
